The Cumberland County Register of Deeds office received an International Association of Government Officials Innovator Award at the association's annual conference held in Houston in July.

The Register of Deeds received the International Association of Government Officials Innovator Award: Recorder's Division in recognition of unique achievements and best practices to serve customers.

The following criteria were required to be a recipient of an award:

- The best practice must reflect the current level of service or program performed by your office.
- The service or program must be unique to your area.

The Register of Deeds office has implemented a number of technology upgrades to better serve the citizens of Cumberland County. The upgrades include electronic recordings, online vital records, the instant recording of real estate records, three marriage license kiosks and the ability to submit the data for a marriage license online.

In addition to the valuable services, the selection committee also considered the Register of Deeds annual Book Bag Drive for the homeless children in Cumberland County Schools. The book bag drive collects supplies to fill 850 book bags to be donated for approximately 650 homeless school children, as well as 200 additional bags for homeless relief events and the American Red Cross to help families who have experienced a disaster.

SUBJECT: APPROVAL FOR TAX COLLECTORS PRELIMINARY REPORT AND PROPOSED ANNUAL SETTLEMENT

BACKGROUND

North Carolina General Statutes, Section 105-373 requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the

1st day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of County Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to him for collection for the past year. The Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement. The preliminary report consists of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the tax year of 2018-2019 remain unpaid, (ii) a list of the persons not owning real property whose taxes for the year 2018-2019 remain unpaid (the proposed insolvent list), and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes. The proposed settlement consists of the amounts of taxes with which the Tax Collector has been charged for the year and the amounts of credits against such charges, the real and personal property tax balance is charged to the forthcoming tax year. The preliminary report has been provided to the County Clerk to the Board.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

As required by NCGS 105-373, the Tax Collector recommends the Board of Commissioners accept the preliminary report and approve the proposed annual settlement. Recommend the Board adopts the resolution attached as Exhibit A.

- 2. That the Board hereby finds that the persons in the list of those that do not own or have not listed real property are insolvent as that term is used in G.S. 105-373, directs that the list of such person be entered into the minutes of the meeting of the Board as the insolvent list, and further directs that the amounts in such list be, and hereby are, credited to the Tax Collector in his annual settlement;
- 3. That the proposed settlement of the Tax Collector, appended hereto, for taxes in his hands for collection for the fiscal tax year 2018-2019, be and it hereby is, approved and that he be, and thereby is, charged with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Charges" and credited with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Credits".

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF UPDATED DEPARTMENTAL EXEMPTIONS TO THE DAILY DEPOSIT REQUIREMENT

BACKGROUND

In accordance with North Carolina General Statute 159-32, all money collected by a local government must be deposited daily. An exemption is allowed when money on hand is less than \$500. This exemption must be granted by the governing board. Until deposited, all moneys must be maintained in a secure location. In addition, regardless of the amount of funds on hand, a deposit must be made before the last business day of each month.

Official records indicate the Board of Commissioners approved individual departmental daily deposit exemptions at different times going back to 1988. The previously approved departmental exemption no longer applies to Animal Control or Planning based upon recent tracking of average daily deposit amounts. The finance director recommends the following departments be approved for an exception to the daily deposit requirement:

- · Board of Elections
- · Child Support
- · Cooperative Extension
- Employee Pharmacy
- · Public Utilities
- · Soil & Water Conservation
- Tax Administration (specific only to fees for copies of tax related documents and land record fees)

If approved, this departmental exemption listing will supersede all prior approvals for the daily deposit exemption.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

Exempt the following departments from the daily deposit requirement as provided in NCGS 159-32: Board of Elections, Child Support, Cooperative Extension, Employee Pharmacy, Public Utilities, Soil & Water Conservation, and Tax Administration (specific only to fees for copies of tax related documents and land record fees). The exemption will become effective immediately upon approval.

Each August a national event occurs called "Clear the Shelter." It is a joint effort between the Humane Society of the United States, NBC media network and corporate sponsors. This year the event will be on Saturday, August 17th from 10am-6pm located at Cumberland County Animal Control. Cumberland County Animal Control participated in the 2018 event, which was very successful, adopting out virtually all our adoptable animals. In order to participate in the event, Cumberland County is required to waive fees for every adoptable animal in the shelter. The goal is to get every adoptable animal a new home. Depending on the number of animals available, this could mean waiving fees upwards of \$10,000. During the 2018 event our shelter had over 700 people attend and 119 animals adopted. Participating animal shelters, and national organizations such as ASPCA and Best Friends Animal Society, see the positive publicity and decrease in animal euthanasia as far outweighing the loss in fees for events such as this. WRAL TV will be broadcasting from area shelters all day to promote the event. They will also be doing stories on responsible pet ownership throughout the week prior to the event. Last year, area shelters placed over 1,200 animals through Clear the Shelter (www.cleartheshelters.com).

SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CUMBERLAND COUNTY AND THE CENTER FOR HUMAN TRAFFICKING COURT SOLUTIONS

BACKGROUND

The Center for Human Trafficking Court Solutions (CHTCS) is a non-profit organization dedicated to assisting State courts address human trafficking. CHTCS was awarded a grant on behalf of the Cumberland County Court System from the North Carolina Human Trafficking Commission. The purpose of the grant is to develop a pilot court response to human trafficking for the benefit of the Cumberland County Courts, and to foster a statewide court response to human trafficking. The key components of this project are:

- 1. Develop a trauma informed court response under the direction of the assigned Court Judge, with the assistance of CHTCS and others retained to share national and local expertise;
- 2. General education of all Cumberland County Courts, with greater depth and details executed with the assigned Court Judge's court personnel about human trafficking, opportunities for court responses, including collaboration leadership, etc.; and
- 3. Research designed to produce evidence based recommendations that include measuring key attributes of collaborative responses among key court stakeholders, which responses streamline and insure best practices that produce best outcome for human trafficking survivors.

The Cumberland County Courts have requested that Cumberland County Government act in the capacity of contracting agency for the engagement of a Human Trafficking Court Coordinator and part-time administrative assistance. A total of \$74,000 is available for this staff support. CHTCS has provided the attached Memorandum of Understanding for consideration by the Board of County Commissioners. The term of said agreement would be effective upon approval and expire at June 30, 2020.

Upon approval, Management will seek services from interested and qualified individuals and enter into a contract for provision of services.

Management requests approval of the Memorandum of Understanding with the Center for Human Trafficking Court Solutions and authorize the County Manager to sign said agreement.

Memorandum of Understanding Between Cumberland County and the Center for Human Trafficking Court Solutions

This document constitutes a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Cumberland County (CC), North Carolina (NC) and the Center for Human Trafficking Court Solutions (CHTCS), a 501(c)(3) non-profit charity organized under the laws of the District of Columbia, that memorializes agreement that CHTCS will provide CC grant funds it is administering on behalf of the NC Human Trafficking Commission (NCHTC) and CC will use those funds for the sole purpose of CC contracting with an individual to serve as the Court Coordinator to the "We Overcome Recidivism Through Healing" (WORTH) Court and providing office space for this contractor. This MOU will also pertain to the contracting of an administrative position identified in the NCHTC grant proposal, should all parties be in agreement that said support is required.

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, the WORTH Court's success with its goals for human trafficking survivors and for fulfilling its responsibilities to Cumberland County residents and the North Carolina court system depends on significant and continuous outreach to justice system stakeholders in Cumberland County (community leaders, law enforcement, prosecutors, public defenders, the judiciary, service providers, educators, community organizations and residents, etc.); and

WHEREAS, the WORTH Court needs the support of a coordinator and potentially an administrative assistant to accomplish its goals; and

WHEREAS neither the Cumberland County courts nor CHTCS can hire a coordinator and/or administrative assistant as an employee or a contractor, which positions are provided in the NCHTC grant; and

WHEREAS the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners supports its courts and is supportive of assisting the WORTH Court with its mission, CC is willing to be the hiring agent for the Court Coordinator, and if needed, the Court Administrative Assistant; and

WHEREAS the NCHTC has agreed to a 6-month extension of the grant to enable this contract hire(s) for a nearly full-year term to end June 30, 2020; and further that the NCHTC has approved CC as the hiring agent for contractor(s) position(s) thereby enabling CHTCS as NCHTC grant administrator to transfer funds to CC as provided in the NCHTC grant for this Coordinator position in a sum not to exceed \$58,000 for the term of the contract; and for this Administrative Assistant position in a sum not to exceed \$18,000 for the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS CC, in partnership with the WORTH court, is not restricted in starting the search process immediately for Coordinator contractor because the position will not be a permanent employee of CC; and

WHEREAS the CC Board of Commissioners will consider this MOU and proposal for CC to hire contractor(s) at its August 5th regular meeting, and the hire, if approved, will occur shortly thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the NCHTC grant also allocates \$18,000 to office rent that CC wishes to be allocated instead to survivor services as it will provide in-kind the office space to contract Coordinator and Assistant; and further that CC understands that the Executive Director of NCHTC will consider such requests for survivor support on a seriatim basis as they are identified by the WORTH court for reallocation of such monies;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of, and incorporating such afore-stated background and understandings, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. CHTCS will have no relationship, obligations or responsibilities to CC or its contract hire(s) except to provide up to \$58,000 for the hire of coordinator contractor; and potentially provide up to \$18,000 for administrative contractor.
- 2. CHTCS will issue a check within 30 days upon receipt of CC invoice for NCHTC grant funds as specified herein.
- 3. CHTCS will provide equipment to the WORTH court as defined in NCHTC grant proposal and CC will bear no responsibility for such equipment.
- 4. CC will partner with WORTH court in selecting the best candidate to perform under contract the Coordinator job defined in Exhibit A to serve the WORTH court.
- 5. CC will hire the Coordinator candidate that the WORTH court and CC mutually agree to hire to serve the WORTH court as soon as practicable after the August 5th regular meeting of the CC Board of County Commissioners.
- 6. CC will provide office space for contracted Coordinator and contracted administrative assistant (should that position be required).

Center for Human Trafficking Court Solutions By: Marsha Rabiteau, Esq. President and CEO

Overview:

The Cumberland County Courts (CC court) are developing a court response to human trafficking survivors. The court will partner with national and North Carolina experts and key stakeholders to first design its program, but which will certainly involve continuing work with the local and state stakeholders. The CC Court is creating a staff position to assist the team of stakeholders achieve the CC court's short and long term goals broadly defined as working with other stakeholders to create a comprehensive approach to identifying and assisting human trafficking survivors in Cumberland County restore their lives as they choose. This staff position is Human Trafficking Court Coordinator to the County's pilot court for human trafficking survivors.

Background:

The Center for Human Trafficking Court Solutions [(501(c)(3) dedicated to assisting state courts address human trafficking] was awarded a grant on behalf of Cumberland County Courts from the North Carolina Human Trafficking Commission. The purpose of the grant is to develop a pilot court response to human trafficking for the benefit of CC courts, but to also foster a statewide court response to human trafficking. The key components of this project are: 1) develop a trauma informed court response under the direction of the assigned Court Judge, with the assistance of CHTCS and others retained to share national and local expertise; 2) general education of all CC Courts, with greater depth and details executed with the assigned Court Judge's court personnel about human trafficking, opportunities for court responses, including collaboration leadership, etc.; 3) research designed to produce evidence based recommendations that include measuring key attributes of collaborative responses among key court stakeholders, which responses streamline and insure best practices that produce best outcome for human trafficking survivors.

Profile of the Ideal Candidate:

This position requires a person who is passionate about Cumberland County courts serving its constituents with highest quality justice; who wants to participate and serve the goals of a high powered team on a ground-breaking project; who places service to the overall project and its participants first and foremost in fulfilling this position's responsibilities; who possesses high emotional intelligence and excellent communication skills; who understands and knows how to build relationships and who can astutely identify and navigate organizational cultures and potentially conflicting roles and responsibilities of participating collaborators; who is organized and committed to "on time or before" deadlines; who identifies project issues in a time-sensitive manner and elevates them promptly to appropriate decision-makers; who is flexible and can greet obstacles with a "can do" attitude; who is 110% committed to the success of this project and organization involved in achieving the assigned Judge's goals for the project. The successful candidate will be a strong advocate who is passionate about ending human trafficking in Cumberland County through court leadership and court responses.

Qualifications:

Bachelor's degree required; experience working in a specialty court, in or with the North Carolina courts preferred. Will consider applicants with experience in law enforcement, health and human services, public defenders and prosecutors, victim advocates or others with experience working with trauma victims.

Responsibilities:

- The overarching responsibility of the HT Coordinator will be to maximize the assigned Judge's time by addressing the many administrative functions attendant to working with a core team (Advisory Group and Stakeholder Group), with community collaborators and others. The HT Coordinator will help secure results on this project by helping the Judge manage the project interface with the CC courts and others so that the court and other impacted personnel can remain dedicated to their primary job responsibilities and engage when their expertise and input is needed.
- 2. The HT Coordinator will be responsible for calendaring and supporting meetings and other events associated with this project with the Advisory Group in the formative stages of the project, and then with the CC Court key stakeholders as the project evolves to include them in the planning and execution phases of the project. Each such meeting will have a purpose and goal(s) that the HT Coordinator is charged to help achieve with excellent results.
- 3. The HT Coordinator will draft communications for assigned Court Judge to send to the Advisory group, key stakeholders, community leaders and others. The HT Coordinator will be sensitive to communication needs for the project and elevate them to assigned Court Judge's attention so that no opportunity is missed to minimize potential problems and to maximize opportunities to advance the goals of the project.
- 4. The HT Coordinator will be a fully functioning member of the Advisory Group and will memorialize commitments, timeframes and results in order to provide project management assistance to CHTCS. The HT Coordinator will assist the assigned Court Judge and CHTCS with other management tasks that will insure the success of this grant in terms of the HT Commission expectations and requirements.
- The HT Coordinator will regularly revisit program mission, goals & objectives with team leadership and members as appropriate to assure their efficacy and application, and timely completion.
- 6. The HT Coordinator will be a fully functioning member of the Cumberland County stakeholder team, and will work with the collaboration experts and others to effectuate the education and research goals of the project. These responsibilities will likely include among others during the implementation of the project: assistance collecting data, being fully apprised of the activity of the team and its members particularized focus, assist in conducting quality assurance of each team member, assuring confidential maintenance of client data that is kept current, helping coordinate services from each discipline, and the local community, in a manner that is most therapeutic to the participant.
- 7. The HT Coordinator will help develop a communications protocol for informing law enforcement and prosecutor authorities that provides information about the progress of survivors without compromising the confidentiality needs of the survivor and the ethical obligations of the court and possibly service providers.
- 8. The HT Coordinator will participate fully as a HT Court team member in staffing meetings, committing him or herself to the program mission & goals and will work as a full partner to ensure their success.
- 9. The HT Coordinator may be called upon to assist with funder relationships and or grant applications that might be needed to sustain the pilot court when the grant expires.

Additionally, the HT Coordinator will work with the collaboration experts in the collection of data that can be used to demonstrate the improved economics and humanitarian impact of the pilot court to government decision-makers. The HT Coordinator will assist the assigned Court Judge in outreach efforts that demonstrate the impact the pilot court is having on the survivors, the CC courts and the stakeholders.


