BACKGROUND

Eric Cain filed suit against Cumberland County, the Cumberland County Civic Center Commission, and Global Spectrum in North Carolina Civil Superior Court, seeking monetary damages for allegations of negligence in a slip and fall incident of February 17, 2017, at the Crown Expo Center. In the closed session of the June 15, 2020, meeting of the Board of Commissioners, the Board indicated its consent for settlement of this action for up to \$20,000. The County reached settlement with Cain in which the County would pay \$20,000 in exchange for a release of all claims against the County Defendants and the filing of a voluntary dismissal with prejudice. The Settlement Agreement and Release have been fully executed, the monies paid, and the dismissal filed. The Settlement Agreement is attached.

County Attorney recommended this settlement to avoid further litigation costs, including the expenses associated with trial.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

Formally approve settlement in 19 CVS 5062, Eric Cain v. Cumberland County, Cumberland County Civic Center Commission, and Global Spectrum, LP for \$20,000 from County Defendants with Cain releasing all claims against the County Defendants and filing a dismissal of the lawsuit.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND RELEASE

This Agreement is entered into by and between 1) Eric Cain and 2) Cumberland County and the Cumberland County Civic Center Commission (collectively, "County").

Statement of Purpose

WHEREAS, Eric Cain filed an action ("Lawsuit") against County in The North Carolina General Court of Justice, Superior Court Division, Cumberland County, 19 CVS 5062, seeking relief for alleged negligence by County and others; and

WHEREAS, Eric Cain and County have reached a settlement of all issues raised in the Lawsuit, and wish to reduce their agreement to writing.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein, Eric Cain and County agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Payment by County</u>. In consideration of this Agreement and other good and valuable consideration, County agrees to pay, and Eric Cain agrees to accept, the amount of TWENTY THOUSAND AND 00/100'S DOLLARS (\$20,000.00), payable upon full execution of this Agreement as reflected by the date of the last signature affixed below.
- 2. <u>Dismissal of Claims in the Lawsuit</u>. Eric Cain and County agree that, within seven (7) days of fulfillment of County's obligation to make the payment as outlined in Paragraph 1 of this Agreement, Eric Cain will dismiss his claims against County in the Lawsuit, with prejudice.
- 3. Release of County. In consideration of the undertakings set forth in the Agreement, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Eric Cain for himself and his agents, representatives, successors, assigns, and heirs, hereby releases, discharges, and holds harmless County and its agents, representatives, successors, and assigns, from any and all claims, demands, debts, liabilities, obligations, causes of action, or other claims for relief, of whatever kind or nature, which he has or claims to have had arising out of the events, claims, and allegations in the Lawsuit.
- 4. <u>Costs</u>. Eric Cain and County agree that each shall bear its own costs in connection with the Lawsuit.
- 5. <u>No Admission of Liability</u>. Eric Cain and County hereby acknowledge that this Agreement does not constitute an admission of any sort by County as to the claims described in the Lawsuit, County specifically denying any and all liability.
- 6. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of North Carolina.

- 7. <u>Survival of Agreement</u>. The terms, provisions, and conditions of this Agreement are binding upon Eric Cain and County and their respective successors and assigns. Causes of action based upon the breach of this Agreement shall survive the execution of this Agreement.
- 8. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts and each counterpart will become effective and binding on the date of full execution of this Agreement. A facsimile signature or digital signature to this Agreement shall be deemed to be and may be relied upon as an original. Likewise, telecopy or other electronic transmission by the executing party of an executed counterpart of this Agreement shall be deemed delivery of an original, executed counterpart.
- 9. <u>Severability</u>. If any term, provision or condition contained in this Agreement shall, to any extent, be ruled invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Agreement (or the application of such term, provision or condition to persons or circumstances other than those in respect of which it is invalid or unenforceable), shall not be affected thereby, and each and every other term, provision and condition of this Agreement shall be enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 10. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. The terms of this Agreement are contractual and not mere recitals. The Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between Eric Cain and County pertaining to the subject matter hereof, fully supersedes any and all prior agreements or understanding between these parties hereto pertaining to the subject matter hereof, and there are no representations, warranties, covenants, promises or undertakings, oral or otherwise, that are not expressly set forth or expressly incorporated herein by reference.

BACKGROUND

General Fund 101

1) Heath Department - Budget Ordinance Amendment B210426 to recognize state Tobacco Prevention Program funds in the amount of \$38,709.

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B210426 to recognize state Tobacco Prevention Program funds in the amount of \$38,709. These funds will be used to subcontract with the University of North Carolina (UNC) Lineberger Cancer Center to form a Military Health and Readiness Initiative. This team will address tobacco use by the active duty population.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

2) Health Department – Budget Ordinance Amendment B210592 to recognize state funds from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Division of Public Health in the amount of \$546,323.

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B210592 to recognize state funds from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Public Health in the amount of \$546,323. This funding will be used to prevent, prepare and respond to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) by carrying out surveillance, epidemiology, laboratory capacity, infection control, mitigation, communications, and other preparedness and response activities.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

3) Health Department - Budget Ordinance Amendment B210594 to recognize state funds from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Division of Public Health in the amount of \$31.997.

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B210594 to recognize state funds from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Division of Public Health in the amount of \$31,997. These funds will be used to help provide supplemental nutritious foods, nutrition education and referrals to health care for low-income persons during critical periods of growth and development.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

Crown Center Fund 600

4) Crown Center – Budget Ordinance Amendment B210601 to recognize Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and NC Disaster Reimbursement funds in the amount of \$113,812.

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B210601 to recognize FEMA and NC Disaster Reimbursement funds in the amount of \$113,812. These funds will be used to perform Crown Theatre Facilities repairs on the breezeway, as well as replacement of several parking lot lights and various repairs of damages at the Coliseum, all as a result of Hurricane Florence.

REGARDING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS #5 - #21 PLEASE NOTE:

Each fiscal year County departments may have projects that have been approved and initiated but were not complete by the fiscal year end (6/30/20) or items ordered that had not been received by fiscal year end. These projects or items were approved in the Fiscal Year 2020 budget; however, the money was not spent by June 30, 2020.

The following amendments seek to bring those funds forward from FY 2020 into the current fiscal year, allowing departments to complete and pay for these projects and items. These revisions are not using 'new' funds but are recognizing the use of FY20 funds in FY21.

General Fund 101

5) Facilities Maintenance, Department of Social Services, Industrial Park – Budget Ordinance Amendment B210945 to re-appropriate funds for FY20 projects that were not completed in the amount of \$272,335

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B210945 to re-appropriate funds for FY20 projects that were not completed in the amount of \$272,335.

6) Human Resources – Budget Ordinance Amendment B211240 to re-appropriate tuition assistance funds in the amount of \$500

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B211240 to re-appropriate tuition assistance funds in the amount of \$500. These funds were approved for use in FY20, but the course

did not end until FY21.

7) Library – Budget Ordinance Amendment B210904 to re-appropriate FY20 maintenance and repair funds in the amount of \$2,815

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B210904 to re-appropriate FY20 maintenance and repair funds in the amount of \$2,815. These funds will be used to complete a sliding door repair that was not completed in FY20.

8) Library Grants – Budget Ordinance Amendment B210075 to re-appropriate e-rate funds in the amount of \$179,065.

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B210075 to re-appropriate e-rate funds in the amount of \$179,065.

9) Animal Control – Budget Ordinance Amendment B210219 to re-appropriate FY20 grant and donation funds in the amount of \$82,729

The Sheriff's Office is fortunate to again be eligible to apply for funding from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) through the United States Department of Justice (USDOJ). This grant continues the USDOJ efforts to support local law enforcement at the local level.

The Cumberland County Sheriff's Office and the City of Fayetteville Police Department must submit a joint application, but each agency may use the funds for their own priorities. The grant allocation is \$147,229, with \$17,594 for the Sheriff's Office and \$129,635 for the City of Fayetteville Police Department.

The USDOJ requires the public be offered an opportunity to comment. The Sheriff's Office will publicly advertise the grant opportunity in the Fayetteville Observer on Saturday, August 22, 2020. We request approval for a Public Hearing to be held at the Board of Commissioners meeting on Tuesday, September 8, 2020.

A Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Fayetteville, which is required, has been prepared. The enclosed Program Narrative describes the intended use of the grant.

In addition, we are enclosing the "Certifications and Assurances by the Chief Executive of the Application Government" form, which must be signed by the Chairman of Board of Commissioners.

Conduct the Public Hearing, approve the Memorandum of Understanding, complete the Certification and Assurances by the Chief Executive Of the Applicant Government form, and authorize the County Manager to sign the application submittal.

BACKGROUND

As was briefly mentioned at the end of your August 13th Agenda Session meeting, staff received notice from the North Carolina Office of State Budget & Management, on July 31st, that H.B. 1023/S.L. 2020-80 appropriated an additional \$150 million to be distributed to county governments. This brings the total Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) appropriation to \$300 million. In previous legislation, counties could choose to share these funds with municipalities. S.L. 2020-80 changed that language to direct that counties must give a minimum of 25% of their total allocation to municipalities. The legislation gave municipalities until September 1st to submit their plans requesting funds to the counties. Staff immediately notified all nine municipalities of the second round of funding and communicated the September 1st deadline for plan submission. Once received, counties have only until September 15th to submit modified plans to the State.

The following is a snapshot of CRF funding:

Original Cumberland County allocation \$ 5,708,842 Additional Cumberland County allocation 6,511,541 Total Cumberland award 12,220,383 Required municipal 25% (3,055,096) Net County available funding 9,165,287

Because of the State-mandated September 15, 2020 submission deadline for revised plans, staff is presenting the attached modified CRF plan for your consideration. The modified plan includes consideration of additional funding for Fayetteville, Hope Mills, and Spring Lake (as they were the three municipalities that requested additional funding), and staff's recommendation for the most streamlined way to report and account for these

federal funds. Should the Board be comfortable with approval of the revised CRF plan (to include the additional municipal amounts), we would request your at this meeting. Should you need or desire further deliberation, we would ask that you consider suspension of your rule that you do not take action at your September 10th Agenda Session meeting and that you adopt the plan at that Thursday session.

Staff will also initiate a discussion of additional funding options available to the Board to meet COVID-related operational and community needs.
