







TOBACCO eighteen twenty-one

- December 2019, legislation was signed to amend the Federal Food, Drug, & Cosmetic Act, and raise the federal minimum age of sale of tobacco products from 18 to 21 years.
- No exemption for sales to members of military, or grandfathering of age groups
- Does not require that states pass laws raise the age, but does require compliance with federal law



Proclamation for "World Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Day"

WHEREAS, in 2020, an estimated 57,600 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 47,050 will die from the disease;

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, is currently the third leading cause of cancer death in the United States and it is projected to soon become the second leading cause;

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is a major cancer with the lowest five-year survival rate at just 10 percent;

WHEREAS, when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally in later stages, and 71 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis, while 90 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years;

WHEREAS, approximately 1,450 deaths occurred in North Carolina in 2019 according to the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network;

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of Cumberland County are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about the symptoms and risk factors of pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes and effective treatments.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, that the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners hereby designates November 19, 2020 as "World Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Day."
