## Storytelling Festival to Kickoff March 11 at Segra Stadium

FAYETTEVILLE, N.C.– The Cumberland County Public Library kicks off the 13th Annual Storytelling Festival at Segra Stadium on Friday, March 11, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. Everyone is welcome to this family friendly event.

Dr. Brian Sturm, a feature storyteller, shares stories about the wonderous sky. Stories, games and fun will be on-hand for all participants at the March 11 event.

The free storytelling festival will take place March 1-31 throughout the Cumberland County Library System with virtual and in-person stories and activities for children from birth to age 12. The Cumberland County Public Library received a \$5,000 grant from the Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County in August 2021 for the Storytelling Festival.

The theme for this year's festival is "The Sun, the Moon, and the Stars." Programs and activities will focus on the solar system and the stars while exposing participants to stories and myths about the heavens from a variety of cultures.

"The Arts Council is pleased to partner with the Cumberland County Public Library in support of their annual Storytelling Festival," said Bob Pinson, Interim President and CEO of the Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County. "Project Support Grants for 2021-2022 will help fund arts, culture and history projects throughout Cumberland County."

"These initiatives help strengthen our communities through festivals and concerts, youth education programs, art exhibitions, workshops and more," Pinson added.

Project Support Grants increase opportunities for access to arts, science, cultural, and historical programming in Cumberland County. The grants are awarded to nonprofit agencies in Cumberland County that demonstrate financial and administrative stability.

"Storytelling and events like the storytelling festival are critical for encouraging literacy and promoting discovery and learning in our community," said Faith Phillips, Cumberland County Public Library Director. "Storytelling helps listeners be creative and to use their imagination, all skills that can foster literacy and a love of reading."

#### About the Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County:

The Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County is a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organization based in Fayetteville, NC that supports individual creativity, cultural preservation, economic development, and lifelong learning through the ARTS. Founded in 1973, the Arts Council has served as a link between artists, arts, and cultural organizations, and the greater community by administering programs in partnership with a

variety of local agencies to stimulate community and economic growth, reinforce child education, and enhance the cultural identity of the arts and entertainment district.

In the fiscal year 2020-21, the Arts Council distributed \$1.1M in grant funds and allocations to Cumberland County arts and culture nonprofit organizations, artists, and municipalities. The Arts Council's grants, programs, and services are funded in part by contributions from community partners, and through grants from the City of Fayetteville, Cumberland County, and the N.C. #### **BACKGROUND**

Funds in the amount of \$38,500.00 have been appropriated in the Community Development Department's fiscal year 2022 budget to purchase a new software to replace the current Loan's software. Cumberland County's Innovation and Technology Services staff worked with Community Development staff in recommending the best option. The recommended software will expand on what the current software offers by allowing Community Development to manage loans, applications, calculate loan payments, manage bid and contract information as well as provide inspection functionality for construction contracts, managed by Community Development staff.

This software is an advanced platform that no other hosted software is available to provide that can address in one solution the automation of the enrollment, qualification, administration and reporting for all of Cumberland County's Community Development programs.

Benevate Inc. is the producer and sole source vendor of Neighborly Software's Housing, Economic and Community Development hosted software. Benevate, Inc. further certifies that no other hosted software is available for purchase that can address all of Cumberland County's Community Development Department needs in one solution.

#### RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

Finance and Purchasing staff recommend utilizing the sole source bid exception based on North Carolina General Statute 143-129 (e) (6) (ii), as product is available from only one source.

#### **BACKGROUND**

#### **General Fund 101**

1) Emergency Services - Budget Ordinance Amendment B221055 to recognize North Carolina Department of Public Safety Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) funds in the amount of \$4,718

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B221055 to recognize North Carolina Department of Public Safety Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) funds in the amount of \$4,718. In the FY22 budget, \$78,000 was budgeted for this grant, but the total award amount will be \$82,718, an increase of \$4,718. These funds will be used to assist with the purchase of items and courses for the Emergency Management section.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

2) Public Safety Other – Budget Ordinance Amendment B220889 to appropriate fund balance in the amount of \$248,000 for youth detention subsidies

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B220889 to appropriate fund balance in the amount of \$248,000 for youth detention subsidies. The North Carolina Youth Detention Subsidy is based on the length of time a Judge remands a juvenile at their discretion. This amount includes projected expenses over the budgeted amount for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2022.

Please note this amendment requires appropriation of general fund balance.

## 3) Health Department - Budget Ordinance Amendment B221010 to budget Medicaid funds in the amount of \$278,345.

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B221010 in the amount of \$278,345 to budget Medicaid (Prepaid Health Plan) funds. As part of the transition to Managed Care on July 1, 2021, the cost settlement process has changed to a quarterly settlement for services rendered under a Prepaid Health Plan. Local Health Departments will receive 100% of the cost settlement funds from the Prepaid Health Plans but will be required to submit an Intergovernmental Transfer for the non-federal share of the settlement payment to North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Services.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

## 4) Department of Social Services – Budget Ordinance Amendment B220753 to recognize Pandemic Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) funds in the amount of \$2,961,784 from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B220753 to recognize Pandemic Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) funds from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services in the amount of \$2,961,784. These funds will be used for a pandemic automatically authorized payment for households with children aged 0-10 that are receiving food and nutrition services (FNS) and received LIEAP Fiscal Year 2020-2021.
