History

- 2002 Linden and Vander Water and Sewer Districts created
- 2009 Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District created, part of masterplan for developing countywide water system
- 2011 Gray's Creek Water System referendum failed
- 2017 GenX discovered in the Cape Fear River
- 2019 Consent Order between NCDEQ, Cape Fear River Watch and Chemours
- 2022 County unable to secure a commitment from Chemours to assist with water district construction




History

- March 2022 County filed lawsuit against Chemours. Process may take several years.
- June 2022 New EPA Health Advisories announced. Estimated 1,300 additional private well users in Cumberland County will be eligible for whole building filtration or public water connection.

EPA also announced the Emerging Contaminants in Small or Disadvantaged Communities grants from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law







Gray's Creek District

- Funding allocated \$21M by Cumberland County
 - \$10M County ARPA
 - \$10M County Capital Investment Fund
 - \$ 1M Cumberland County Schools for Phase 1
- Other potential sources of federal funding
 - Drinking Water SRF
 - State grants
 - USDA
 - Previously mentioned EPA grants



Gray's Creek District – Phase 1

- Approve Organization Action Resolution granting chairman and County manager authority to execute applications, certifications, resolution or other documents
- Encroachment agreements, easements, permitting, bid preparation
- Bulk water agreement with PWC
- Communications plan and community meetings for early sign up



Addressing contamination beyond Gray's Creek

- Determine feasibility of providing water to rural residents with contaminated wells through water districts
- Prioritize districts based on contamination levels
- Create two new water and sewer districts Cedar Creek and East Central Districts
- Explore feasibility of serving the existing Vander District
- Ensure districts are financially viable















Process to determine citizen interest/feasibility

- Early sign-up is critical
- Customer participation level will determine economic feasibility of developing a water service system
- Explore funding options
- Individual water and sewer districts may obtain loan and/or grant funding for constructing and/or extending water and sewer systems



Water supply sources for districts

- PWC The County has an existing bulk water agreement
- Other sources County is exploring other water sources including confined aquifers that are deeper than the surficial aquifer that many existing wells already use
- Regardless of the water source, the County will add additional treatment as necessary for the removal of PFAS
- The finished water sold by the County will meet all the requirements of the EPA as required by the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act



Next Steps

- Consider the creation of two new districts
- Consider holding a public hearing on August 15 at 6:45 p.m. regarding the creation of the water and sewer districts
- Fall funding deadline is September 30
- Districts would submit separate funding applications





- Open a canvassing period to determine the level of interest and where it will be most feasible to serve water in the other phases of Gray's Creek, the proposed two new districts and Vander
- Allow people to sign up at reduced tap fee during the canvassing period
- Based on taps purchased during this period, County will conduct preliminary engineering reports to determine the final costs for the customer



A request was received from the Cumberland County Emergency Management Coordinator for a proclamation recognizing August 2022 as "**Cumberland County Preparedness Month**".



COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND



WHEREAS, all North Carolinians should be prepared for natural and man-made disasters as well as disease outbreaks; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina is traditionally an active state for tornadoes and severe thunderstorms, with tornado touchdowns and straight-line winds causing severe damage in parts of the state this year; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the state experienced 21 tornado touchdowns, 109 flood incidents and 344 severe thunderstorms with damaging wind and 101 thunderstorms with wind and hail; and

WHEREAS, last year the National Weather Service in North Carolina issued 194 tornado warnings and 1,114 severe thunderstorm warnings, with an average warning time of 16.6 minutes; and 189 flash flood warnings, with an average warning time of 49 minutes; and

WHEREAS, every community, business, family and individual in Cumberland County must be ready for natural and man-made disasters including tornadoes, flooding, hurricanes, and public disturbances that might disrupt normal daily activities; and

WHEREAS, all Cumberland County residents can take a few simple steps – making a family disaster plan, creating an emergency supply kit, and staying informed – to help make preparedness and personal responsibility a priority; and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County residents should know the risks for their area and plan accordingly, and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County residents should help the elderly and those who cannot help themselves; and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County residents should include the safety of their pets and/or livestock in their emergency plans; and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County, North Carolina Emergency Management and the State of North Carolina have collaborated to recognize August as North Carolina Preparedness Month to encourage Cumberland County residents to be disaster ready.

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF TAX COLLECTOR'S PRELIMINARY REPORT AND PROPOSED ANNUAL SETTLEMENT

BACKGROUND

North Carolina General Statutes, Section 105-373 requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the 1st day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of County Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to him for collection for the past year. The Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement. The preliminary report consists of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the tax year of 2021-2022 remain unpaid, (ii) a list of the persons not owning real property whose taxes for the year 2021-2022 remain unpaid (the proposed insolvent list), and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes. The proposed settlement consists of the amounts of taxes with which the Tax Collector has been charged for the year and the amounts of credits against such charges, the real and personal property tax balance is charged to the forthcoming tax year. The preliminary report has been provided to the County Clerk to the Board.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

As required by NCGS 105-373, the Tax Collector recommends the Board of Commissioners accept the preliminary report and approve the proposed annual settlement.

On June 15, 1998, the Board of Commissioners adopted a resolution found in the statutes allowing disposal of County "personal property, worth less than \$5,000 per item or group of similar items, which have become obsolete, unusable, economically unrepairable, or otherwise surplus to the needs of the county." On October 6, 2008 the Board raised this limit to \$30,000. The approval allows the Assistant County Manager to authorize the disposal.

Please find attached a list of miscellaneous items from various County departments or agencies that met the above criteria and that have been disposed of. As a practice, items from facilities are taken to the Ann Street Landfill for disposal as appropriate. Vehicles, equipment, or tools are placed on GovDeals for auction. Revenues from GovDeals sales are placed in an account and used to offset the cost of replacing County vehicles.



DECLARATION OF THE RESCINDING OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARED ON MARCH 16, 2020, TO COORDINATE RESPONSE AND PROTECTIVE ACTIONS TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY

WHEREAS, COVID 19 is a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death by the SARS Co-V-2 virus, which is a new strain of coronavirus previously unidentified in humans which can spread from person to person; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared COVID-19 as a Public Health Pandemic of International Concern on March 11, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) has warned of the public health threat posed by COVID-19 within the state of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of North Carolina declared a State of Emergency, based on the public health emergency of COVID-19, on March 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of North Carolina has since March 10, 2020, extended the State of Emergency in effect, but at the recent signing of the State Budget the Governor indicated that the North Carolina State of Emergency will be rescinded on or about August 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners did Declare a State of Emergency to Coordinate Response and Protective Actions to Prevent the Spread of Covid-19 within the Jurisdiction of Cumberland County pursuant to Chapter 166A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, and per the terms of that Declaration the State of Emergency would remain in effect until rescinded.

WHEREAS, because of the above-described emergency, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners had determined that there was an imminent threat of the spread of COVID-19 within Cumberland County which created a public health emergency which would likely cause serious illness, loss of life, and disruption of essential services and systems; and

WHEREAS, that subsequent to the Declaration of a State of Emergency by the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners that vaccinations and other safety measures were put into place and made available to the public, and that there has been a reduction in the impact of infection with COVID-19 within Cumberland County, and a decrease in hospitalizations of those infected with COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, that the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners has determined that there is no longer a need for a Declared State of Emergency within Cumberland County, North Carolina at this time.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County under Article 1A of Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes and Chapter 5 of the Cumberland County Code of Ordinances, I hereby declare as follows:

Section 1. That the State of Emergency declared within the jurisdiction of Cumberland County, North Carolina, on March 16, 2020, is hereby rescinded effective immediately.

Section 2. That Notice of this rescinding of the State of Emergency in Cumberland County shall be filed with the Clerk to the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners; distributed to the news media and other organizations calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public; and further distributed as necessary to ensure its full implementation.

LEASE AGREEMENT WITH EMPLOYMENT SOURCE, INC.

This Lease Agreement, made and entered into this 1st day of July, 2022, by and between the COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, North Carolina, referred to herein as LESSOR, and SERVICE SOURCE EMPLOYMENT SERVICES, INC. (DBA, Service Source), a non-profit North Carolina corporation, referred to herein as LESSEE.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County of Cumberland owns certain buildings and a tract of land formerly known as the Cumberland Sheltered Workshop Property which has been declared surplus and is not needed for currently budgeted governmental activity; and

WHEREAS, LESSEE, a North Carolina non-profit corporation, comprised of local citizens, desires to offer rehabilitation services for individuals with disabilities on said premises for the benefit of all the citizens of Cumberland County; and

WHEREAS, such rehabilitation services fulfil a public purpose and will provide a substantial public benefit to the Cumberland County community; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have mutually agreed to the terms of this Lease Agreement as set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and covenants contained in the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Premises:** LESSOR does hereby rent, lease, and demise to LESSEE for and during the term and under the terms and conditions set forth herein, the premises lying and being in Cross Creek Township, Fayetteville, North Carolina, and more particularly described as follows: that parcel consisting of approximately 12.96 acres, located at 600 and 620 Ames Street, Fayetteville, NC, and specifically the buildings known as the Main Office Building, the Overflow Office Space Building, the Training Building, and the Contract Close-Out Building, and described as Tract 1 on the plat recorded in the Cumberland County Register of Deeds in Plat Book 111 at page 69.

2. Term: LESSEE shall have and hold the leased premises for a term which shall commence on the 1st day of July, 2022 and continue for not more than ten (10) years, with either party having the right to terminate this Lease upon giving notice of its intent to terminate twenty-four (24) months in advance of the termination in writing in accordance with the notice provisions of this Agreement.

3. Rent: LESSEE shall pay the LESSOR as rental for the leased premises the sum of ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) annually.

4. Approval: Notice of intent to enter into this Lease was advertised May 23, 2022, in the *Fayetteville Observer* and this Lease was approved by the Board of Commissioners on June 20,2022.

5. Compliance with Applicable Regulations: LESSEE shall use the leased premises at all times during the term hereof in compliance with all building and fire codes, and with all other rules, regulations, ordinances or laws of any governmental authority, entity, board or department having jurisdiction over the same. LESSEE shall, at its sole expense, obtain all required licenses or permits for the conduct of its business within the leased premises. LESSEE shall use its best efforts in good faith not to permit, allow, cause or suffer any act or deed to be performed upon the leased premises which shall cause or be likely to cause injury to any person on the premises. LESSEE will comply with all federal, state, and local laws regulating the conduct of its activities and use of the leased premises.

6. Insurance: LESSEE shall acquire, pay for, and at all times during the term of this Lease maintain Fire and Extended Coverage or All Risks Insurance on all buildings located on the leased premises in the amount of at least \$1,500,000.00, with the County of Cumberland being a named insured thereon. LESSEE shall acquire, pay for, and maintain General Liability Insurance on the leased premises in the amount of at least \$2,000,000.00. Proof of this required insurance shall be delivered to the Cumberland County Attorney, Cumberland County Courthouse, 117Dick Street, 5th Floor, Fayetteville, N.C. 28301 upon execution of this Lease and annually thereafter. Failure of the LESSEE to maintain a current policy of any required insurance shall immediately terminate this Lease.

7. Financial Statements to be Provided: LESSEE shall provide its current financial statement, certified as accurate by the LESSEE's treasurer or chief financial officer, to LESSOR's County Manager prior to execution of this Lease.

8. Annual Audits to be Provided: Throughout the term of this Lease, LESSEE shall provide LESSOR with an annual audit of provided by an independent auditor of LESSEE'S choosing, and at LESSEE'S expense, within 90 days after the close of LESSEE'S fiscal year, which audit shall accurately and completely reflect LESSEE's financial position and results of operation for the annual period covered.

9. Utilities: LESSEE shall be responsible for all utility bills and other expenses incurred in the use of the leased premises.

10. No Warranties as to Condition of Premises: LESSEE ACCEPTS THE LEASED PREMISES "AS IS". LESSOR MAKES NO WARRANTIES OFANY KIND, INCLUDING OF HABITABILITY OR OTHERWISE, CONCERNING ANY BUILDING OR ANY OF THE IMPROVEMENTSLOCATEDONTHELEASEDPREMISES; LESSOR shall not be responsible for any maintenance, repairs, renovations or other work of any kind on-the leased premises.

11. Improvements: LESSEE shall pay for any improvements it may make to the leased premises. Any improvements, construction, substantial renovations or similar alterations shall be submitted at least thirty (30) prior to the anticipated commencement of such activity for consideration and prior approval of the County Manager, which he or she shall not unreasonably withhold.

12. Recovery of Trade Fixtures: At the end of the Lease term, LESSEE may recover such of its trade fixtures, equipment or any other of its improvements which can be so removed without substantial damage to the leased premises, but LESSEE shall be responsible for and shall reimburse and hold LESSOR harmless for any such damage caused to the leased premises resulting in said removal. Any such fixtures, equipmeµ.t or improvements not so removed shall become the property of LESSOR, at its discretion. In the alternative, LESSOR may-require LESSEE to remove the same.

13. Maintenance of Premises: LESSEE shall adequately maintain the premises in a clean, orderly, safe, and attractive manner.

14. **Rights of Inspection:** The County Inspections Department, Health Department, Fire Marshal and any inspectors of the City of Fayetteville shall have free and open access to the leased premises during all hours of operation for the purpose of implementing or enforcing rules, regulations and laws within their respective authority and jurisdiction.

15. Relinquishment of Possession: At the end of this. Lease term, or upon the termination of this Lease by LESSEE's default, LESSEE shall relinquish possession of the leased premises immediately upon LESSOR's written demand. The leased premises shall be returned to the LESSOR in clean and proper order, undamaged, normal wear and tear excepted. Without limiting the foregoing, all duties and responsibilities imposed by this Lease on LESSEE shall remain in full force and effect during any holdover period that LESSEE remains on the leased premises after the expiration of the Lease term or after termination for default.

16. Assignment: This Lease may not be assigned or sub-leased in whole or in part without the prior approval of the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners.

17. Necessity for Public Purpose: LESSEE shall at all times hereunder retain its status as a non-profit, tax-exempt corporation. LESSEE shall use the leased premises only for the primary purpose of providing employment and rehabilitation services for persons with intellectual, developmental or physical disabilities, and those other purposes ancillary and subordinate thereto.

18. Breach: LESSEE'S failure to comply with any provision of this Lease shall constitute a material breach hereof and LESSEE shall be *in* default hereunder. In such event, this Lease shall terminate automatically 10 days after LESSOR shall hand deliver or mail by certified mail, return receipt requested, written "NOTICE OF DEFAULT" to LESSEE and LESSEE shall not have cured such default within such ten (10) day period.

19. Indemnity: LESSEE shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the LESSOR from and against any actual or threatened claim, loss, expense or damage (including attorney fees) to Cumberland County arising out of any act or neglect of the LESSEE or its servants, employees, agents, or invitees, or any change, alteration, or improvement, including but not limited to demolition made by the LESSEE in the leased premises, excepting only claims arising out of acts caused by the affirmative negligence of the LESSOR or its representatives.

20. Notice Required for Alterations: LESSEE shall give LESSOR at least thirty (30) days prior notice of its intent to change, alter, restore, improve, renovate, or demolish any structure on the leased premises, and LESSEE shall not commence any such action without the County Manager's prior written approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

21. Notices to Lessor: All notices to the LESSOR shall be delivered personally to the County Manager's Office or mailed to:

22. Notices to Lessee: All notices to the LESSEE shall be delivered personally to the LESSEE'S office on the leased premises, or mailed to:

Merger: This Lease contains the entire agreement of the parties hereto as to its subject matter and may not be altered, amended or modified except by a writing signed by both parties. No waiver of or delay in exercising any right or power under this Lease shall impair any such right or power, or shall be construed as a waiver of any breach or default, or acquiescence thereto. One or more waivers of any covenant, term or condition of this Lease by either party shall not be construed by the other party as a waiver of a continuing or subsequent breach or default of the same covenant, provision or condition. The consent or approval by either party of any act by the other party of a nature requiring consent or approval shall not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary consent or approval of any subsequent similar act. No provision of this Lease shall be deemed to have been waived unless such waiver be in writing and signed by the waiving party. The receipt by LESSOR of rent with knowledge of or during the existence of any breach or default shall not be deemed a waiver of such breach or default.



SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL IN PRINCIPLE OF THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$27,000,000 EXEMPT FACILITIES REVENUE BONDS BY THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES AND POLLUTION CONTROL FINANCING AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FINANCING TO CARGILL, INCORPORATED

BACKGROUND

The attached resolution describes a project to be undertaken by Cargill, Incorporated to acquire, install and construct solid waste disposal equipment and facilities at its Fayetteville soybean processing facility which is necessary or required for its operations (the "Project"). The cost of the Project is estimated to be \$27,000,000. At its meeting July 28, 2022, the Cumberland County Industrial Facilities and Pollution Control Financing Authority (the "Authority") approved the issuance of exempt facilities revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$27,000,000 for financing the Project in accordance with the applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code. The code requires the board of county commissioners to approve the issuance of these exempt bonds after conducting a public hearing to receive public comments on the matter. The proof of publication of notice of the public hearing is also attached.

Neither the issuance of these exempt facilities bonds nor the Project creates any liability or costs for the county or the Authority.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

The county attorney recommends adoption of the resolution approving the issuance of these exempt facilities bonds for Cargill, Incorporated after consideration of any comments received at the public hearing.

APPROVAL IN PRINCIPLE OF THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$27,000,000 EXEMPT FACILITIES REVENUE BONDS BY THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES AND POLLUTION CONTROL FINANCING AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FINANCING TO CARGILL, INCORPORATED

WHEREAS, The Cumberland County Industrial Facilities and Pollution Control Financing Authority (the "Authority") has agreed to assist in the financing under the North Carolina Industrial and Pollution Control Facilities Financing Act (the "Act") of a special purpose project by Cargill, Incorporated, a Delaware corporation, or a related or affiliated entity (the "Company"), consisting of the acquisition, construction and installation of solid waste disposal facilities and equipment used to capture particulate matter and volatile organic compounds resulting from the processing of soybeans and to process soybean meal and hull waste that would otherwise be sent to a landfill into cattle feed components, and buildings, facilities and equipment necessary or required for the operation of the foregoing facilities and equipment (the "Project") located at the Company's facility in Fayetteville, Cumberland County, North Carolina, and has indicated that agreement by the execution of an Inducement Agreement between the parties dated May 24, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to issue its Exempt Facilities Revenue Bonds (Cargill, Incorporated Project), Series 2022 in the principal amount of up to \$27,000,000 (the "Bonds") in order to provide financing for the Project; and

WHEREAS, on June 29, 2022, under Article 51B of Chapter 143 of the North Carolina General Statutes, the Federal Tax Reform Allocation Committee ("TRAC") allocated a portion of North Carolina's 2022 "private activity bond limit," as defined in Section 141 of the Code to the Project and the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, Section 147 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") requires that the governing body that created the Authority approve the plan of financing that includes the issuance of the Bonds to finance the Project; and

WHEREAS, Section 159C-4 of the Act requires the governing body of the county in which the project to be financed under the Act is located to approve the issuance of the Bonds under the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has been informed that the County will have no liability whatsoever for the repayment of the Bonds or the Project, and that its approval is only to satisfy the requirements of the Code and the Act; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Commissioners today has held a public hearing with respect to the advisability of the Project and the issuance of bonds therefor, as evidenced by the Certificate and Summary of Public Hearing attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County, meeting in regular session at Fayetteville, North Carolina, on August 1, 2022, does the following:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR CUMBERLAND COUNTY:

1. The acquisition, construction and equipping of the proposed Project, which constitutes a "special purpose project" that includes the disposal, treatment or recycling of solid waste located in Fayetteville, Cumberland County, North Carolina, and the issuance of the Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$27,000,000 to provide financing therefor are hereby approved in principle.

2. The Board of Commissioners hereby approves the plan of financing as required by Section 147(f) of the Code.

3. The issuance of the Bonds in the principal amount of up to \$27,000,000 is hereby approved for purposes of Section 159C-4 of the Act.

4. THE BONDS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A DEBT OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR ANY AGENCY THEREOF, INCLUDING THE AUTHORITY AND THE COUNTY, NOR A PLEDGE OF THE FAITH AND CREDIT OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR AGENCY THEREOF, INCLUDING THE COUNTY.

- 2. The Board adopts the Cumberland County Code of Ethics, last revised by the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners April 18, 2022, as it may be revised or amended from time to time, as the code of ethics of the District, to be referenced as the NORCRESS Water and Sewer District Code of Ethics.
- 3. The Board hereby adopts as its Minority/Disadvantaged Business Contracting Goals the Minority/Disadvantaged Business Contracting Goals of Cumberland County, as from time to time in effect.
- 4. The Board authorizes the Chairman or the County Manager from time to time to execute, acknowledge, and deliver any and all applications, certifications, resolutions, or other documents which either may deem necessary or desirable relating to any grant, loan, note, bond or other financing for the project, including, without limitation, to the North Carolina Local Government Commission, the US Department of Agriculture-Rural Development Commission, or any other State or Federal agency.
- 5. This resolution shall be effective upon its adoption as by law provided.
