

To the Board of County Commissioners County of Cumberland Fayetteville, North Carolina

We are engaged to audit the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the aggregate discretely presented component units, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the County of Cumberland for the year ended June 30, 2022. Professional standards require that we provide you with the following information related to our audit. We would also appreciate the opportunity to meet with you to discuss this information further since a two-way dialogue can provide valuable information for the audit process.

OUR RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER U.S. GENERALLY ACCEPTED AUDITING STANDARDS, GOVERNMENT AUDITING STANDARDS AND THE UNIFORM GUIDANCE AND THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE SINGLE AUDIT IMPLEMENTATION ACT.

As stated in our engagement letter dated March 31, 2022, our responsibility, as described by professional standards, is to express opinions about whether the financial statements prepared by management with your oversight are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve you or management of your responsibilities. In planning and performing our audit, we will consider the County's internal control over financial reporting in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements and not to provide assurance on the internal control over financial reporting. We will also consider internal control over compliance with requirements that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal and state program in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on compliance and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with the Uniform Guidance and the North Carolina State Single Audit Implementation Act.

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the County's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we will perform tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions is not an objective of our audit. Also in accordance with the Uniform Guidance and the North Carolina State Single Audit Implementation Act, we will examine, on a test basis, evidence about the County's compliance with the types of compliance requirements described in the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Compliance Supplement and the *Audit Manual for Governmental Auditors in North Carolina*, applicable to each of its major federal and state programs for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the County's compliance with those requirements. While our audit will provide a reasonable basis for our opinion, it will not provide a legal determination on the County's compliance with those requirements.

Generally accepted accounting principles provide for certain required supplementary information (RSI) to supplement the basic financial statements. Our responsibility with respect to Management's Discussion and Analysis, and the RSI for the Local Government Employees' Retirement Fund, the Register of Deed's Supplemental Pension Fund, the Law Enforcement Officer's Special Separation Allowance, and the Other Postemployment Benefits Plan, which supplement the basic financial statements, is to apply certain limited procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. However, the RSI will not be audited and, because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient appropriate evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance, we will not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the RSI.

We have been engaged to report on combining statements, and individual fund statements and schedules, other supplemental information, as listed in the table of contents, and the schedule of expenditures of federal and state awards, which accompany the financial statements but are not RSI. Our responsibility for this supplementary information, as described by professional standards, is to evaluate the presentation of the supplementary information in relation to the financial statements as a whole and to report on whether the supplementary information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

We have not been engaged to report on introductory and statistical sections, which accompany the financial statements but are not RSI. Our responsibility with respect to this other information in documents containing the audited financial statements and auditor's report does not extend beyond the financial information identified in the report. We have no responsibility for determining whether this other information is properly stated. This other information will not be audited and we will not express an opinion or provide any assurance on it.

PLANNED SCOPE, TIMING OF THE AUDIT, AND OTHER

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements; therefore, our audit will involve judgment about the number of transactions to be examined and the areas to be tested.

Our audit will include obtaining an understanding of the entity and its environment, including internal control, sufficient to assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements and to design the nature, timing, and extent of further audit procedures. Material misstatements may result from (1) errors, (2) fraudulent financial reporting, (3) misappropriation of assets, or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to the entity or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of the entity. We will generally communicate our significant findings at the conclusion of the audit. However, some matters could be communicated sooner, particularly if significant difficulties are encountered during the audit where assistance is needed to overcome the difficulties or if the difficulties may lead to a modified opinion. We will also communicate any internal control related matters that are required to be communicated under professional standards.

We wanted to inform you of a recently issued American Institute of Certified Public Accountant Statement on Auditing Standards 134, Auditor Reporting and Amendments, Including Amendments Addressing Disclosures in the Audit of Financial Statements ("SAS 134"). SAS 134 addresses the form and content of the auditor's report. SAS 134 will be effective for audits for periods ending on or after December 15, 2021. We do not expect this to have a significant impact on the recording of financial transactions, but wanted to make you aware of the upcoming changes that will affect our audit financial reporting.

The audit team considers certain audit areas to have higher assessed risks of material misstatement. To address these higher risk areas the audit team will design procedures to address the identified risks and have work performed by an auditor with the appropriate ability and experience. Our team has the appropriate skills needed to perform the audit and no use of a specialist or expert is anticipated.

We have identified the following significant risk of material misstatement as part of our audit planning:

• Management override of controls. While we have no evidence of such at this time, our audit will be designed to test for these situations.

Planning has not concluded, and modifications may be made to the significant risks identified above. If new significant risks are identified after the date of this initial communication, for example during the course of fieldwork, the auditor will communicate them to those charged with governance in a timely manner, in writing.

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF CONTRACT AMENDMENT FOR DISASTER DEBRIS MONITORING WITH TETRA TECH, INC.

BACKGROUND

A contract with Tetra Tech, Inc. was executed in fiscal year 2020 as the result of a formal Request for Proposal (RFP) #20-4-ES II that was conducted for disaster debris monitoring services. The original contract term was through October 30, 2021 with the option to renew for two additional one year terms. This contract allows an increase to rates per the increase to the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). This contract amendment is to extend the contract through October 30, 2023 and to increase the rates by 9.2% per the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). No funding is currently tied to this contract as it is a standby contract, to be utilized in emergency or disaster events (such as a hurricane). In the event that services are required, a notice to proceed will be issued and a contract amendment will be executed to incorporate a "not to exceed" amount.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

Finance and Purchasing staff recommend that the Board of Commissioners approve the contract amendment with Tetra Tech, Inc. to extend the contract term through October 30, 2023 and increase the rates per CPI-U.

This amendment to extend the Service Contract dated January 6, 2020 by and between Tetra Tech, Inc. ("CONTRACTOR") and County of Cumberland ("COUNTY").

WHEREAS, the CONTRACTOR and the COUNTY wish to extend the service contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, the CONTRACTOR and the COUNTY agree as follows:

- 1. Effective August 30, 2022 the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR mutually agree to extend the aforementioned contract through October 30, 2023.
- 2. Effective October 31, 2022 the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR mutually agree to the rate increase of 9.2%, per the increase of the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) based on the latest yearly percentage increase as stated in the Cost Proposal in the original Service Contract dated January 6, 2020. The Proposed Price Increase documents from Tetra Tech, Inc. are included as attachments.
- 3. Except as specifically amended herein, all other terms and provisions of the service contract shall remain in full force and effect.

(Tetra Tech) for a period beginning on January 6, 2020 through October 30, 2021 with the option to renew the contract term for up to two (2) additional one (1) year periods. Tetra Tech is requesting the County to exercise the second renewal option from October 31, 2022 to October 30, 2023 with an adjustment to the hourly rates based on the CPI-U Base Price Adjustment Calculation below:

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF FORMAL BID AWARD AND CONTRACT APPROVAL

FOR DISASTER DEBRIS COLLECTION SERVICES STAND-BY

CONTRACT

BACKGROUND

In the event of a disaster, debris collection services are required for the management of the resulting debris. Stand-by contracts for these services are imperative to have in place as they allow the County to begin serving the community immediately following an event, rather than waiting for a bid process to be completed, as is mandated by the Federal Uniform Guidance Procurement Policy for Local Governments ("Uniform Guidelines"). No funding is currently tied to these contracts as they are stand-by contracts, to be utilized in disaster events (such as a hurricane). In the event that services are required, a notice to proceed will be issued and a contract amendment will be executed to incorporate a "not to exceed" amount.

Proposals were solicited, received, and evaluated by subject matter experts from various departments for this service. Due to the size and complexity of disaster debris projects, the objective was to contract with a primary and secondary vendor for debris collection.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

Finance and Purchasing staff recommend that the Board of Commissioners:

- 1. Award Bid Number 23-7-ES to Primary Vendor: DRC Emergency Services and Secondary Vendor: AshBritt, Inc. using the Uniform Guidelines best overall value standard of award.
- 2. Delegate authority to the County Manager to sign the contracts with DRC Emergency Services and AshBritt, Inc.
