SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF DESTRUCTION OF EMERGENCY SERVICES DEPARTMENT PAPER RECORDS

BACKGROUND

Currently, the Emergency Services Department is migrating from paper file formats to digital format record retention and archiving as part of the County's larger "digital government" initiative. As part of this process, the vendor is securing all historic departmental paper files for off-site scanning and archiving. This includes all file folders, Fire Inspections information.

Once scanned, all files will be wholly duplicated and available in Laserfiche in an identical form as the paper files. As such, the paper files will no longer be needed as the digital copies will be archived, backed up, and readily available. In addition, with the implementation of the ENERGOV system, and the Fire Inspections reporting software, all current records are being accepted and stored solely in digital format. This action to dispose of the paper files will free up a considerable amount of space in Emergency Services storage, ensure the content of the files are

protected from any potential natural disaster impacts and alleviate the need for offsite storage of files. I request permission to authorize the vendor to destroy the paper files once the vendor has scanned all the files, staff has reviewed the digital format for quality control, and all pertinent paper files requested for return from the vendor have been received.

Paper records to be scanned and destroyed are as follows:

- 1. Budget information, invoices, and planning dating back to 2001.
- 2. Fire Inspection receipts dating back to 2018.
- 3. Credit card files from June 2006 to February 2019
- 4. DHS homeland security grants

Items to be destroyed and not scanned:

1. Timesheets dating back to 2004. (finance holds a scanned copy)

- 2. Payroll register and Leave log monthly reports.
- 3. Grants from 2006
- 4. B2 PP=IP Buffer Zone Grants 2005

BACKGROUND

On June 15, 1998, the Board of Commissioners adopted a resolution found in the statutes allowing disposal of County "personal property, worth less than \$5,000 per item or group of similar items, which have become obsolete, unusable, economically unrepairable, or otherwise surplus to the needs of the county." On October 6, 2008, the Board raised this limit to \$30,000. The approval allows the Assistant County Manager to authorize the disposal.

Please find attached a list of miscellaneous items from various County departments or agencies that met the above criteria and that have been approved to be disposed of. As a practice, items given up by County departments as surplus are first offered to other County departments for reuse. Items left unclaimed by other departments after seven days along with end of useful life vehicles are placed on GovDeals for auction. Damaged items or items determined to have no remaining value are taken to Ann Street Landfill for disposal. Revenues from GovDeals sales are placed in an account and used to offset the cost of replacing County vehicles.

SUBJECT: MATCHING FUNDS FOR THE CAB PROGRAM AND ASSOCIATED BUDGET ORDINANCE AMENDMENT B#240911

BACKGROUND

The Board of Commissioners originally allocated \$3,000,000 of the County's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Program funding for physical plant modifications to Public Facilities (BOC Meeting Room). The intent was to renovate the courtroom in the Historic Courthouse into a Boardroom for primary use by the Board of County Commissioners, enhancing its capacity, introducing modular seating, and incorporating capacity for social distancing.

Post analysis, it was determined that the intended scope for the project did not align fully with the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) eligibility criteria. According to the advisement from the County Attorney's Office, it was concluded that only HVAC system enhancements could be potentially considered under SLFRF eligible expenses. The project was temporarily halted pending a comprehensive space and needs assessment by Creech & Associates, PLLC.

In light of that assessment and findings, staff proposes the following reallocation of the ARPA Program funding:

Public Sector Workforce: Rehiring Public Sector Staff - \$3,000,000: Staff recommends reallocating the funds towards the Public Sector Workforce project. The allocation will create additional capacity within the General Fund.

Completing Access to Broadband (CAB) Program - Once the funds are transferred to the General Fund it is recommended that \$2,800,000 be allocated as the thirty-five percent (35%) matching funds required for the CAB Program, proportional to the total program budget of \$8,000,000. This strategic investment is aimed at enhancing broadband access, an essential service that supports economic development, education, and

healthcare. The remaining \$200,000 would be transferred as unallocated within the freed-up capacity project to supplement ongoing and future projects.

At the American Rescue Plan Committee meeting on Thursday, January 25, 2024, the Committee recommended forwarding this request to the Thursday, February 8, 2024 Agenda Session meeting as an Item of Consideration.

At the Thursday, February 8, 2024 Agenda Session, the Board of Commissioners voted unanimously to move this item forward as an an item of consent for the Monday, February 19, 2024 Board of Commissioners Meeting agenda.

BACKGROUND

Since 2021, Attorney General Josh Stein has announced \$56 billion in national settlements with opioid companies that will help bring desperately needed resources to communities harmed by the opioid epidemic. A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the State and local government directs how opioid settlement funds are distributed and used in our state. Prior to spending settlement funds, every local county or municipality must first select which opioid mitigation strategies they would like to fund (Option A or Option B Strategies). Cumberland County is set to receive \$30,822,230 over 18 years.

In August 2022, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners approved a recommendation to explore longer-term opportunities to strategically use the opioid settlement funds. The recommendation included exploring options to construct or release a space for a Recovery Community Center, an initiative consistently proposed during the rapid needs assessment conducted in 2022.

The funding will support a three-year pilot program to establish a C-FORT Recovery Center in an existing county building (707 Executive Place). The aim of the recovery center is to reduce overdoses and deaths through the provision of the following recovery support services:

- Weekly overdose prevention education classes
- Weekly Smart Recovery Group
- Peer support services
- Referrals to treatment and other health services
- Overdose prevention supplies (masks, Naloxone, Xylazine and Fentanyl test strip distribution, disposable rescue breathing masks)

• UberHealth Transportation to recovery support services for participants

Funding will support renovation and repairs to the proposed space. The proposed project includes three (3) new FTE positions:

- C-FORT Recovery Center Manager (Administrative Officer I, grade 111)
- Peer Support Specialist (Community Health Technician, grade 102)
- Office Assistant III (grade 103)



WHEREAS Cumberland County has joined national settlement agreements with companies engaged in the manufacturing, distribution, and dispensing of opioids.

WHEREAS the allocation, use, and reporting of funds stemming from these national settlement agreements and bankruptcy resolutions ("Opioid Settlement Funds") are governed by the Memorandum of Agreement Between the State of North Carolina and Local Governments on Proceeds Relating to the Settlement of Opioid Litigation ("MOA") and the Supplemental Agreement for Additional Funds from Additional Settlements of Opioid Litigation ("SAAF");

WHEREAS Cumberland County has received Opioid Settlement Funds pursuant to these national settlement agreements and deposited the Opioid Settlement Funds in a separate special revenue fund as required by section D of the MOA;

WHEREAS section E.6 of the MOA states that, before spending opioid settlement funds, the local government's governing body must adopt a resolution that:

- (i) indicates that it is an authorization for expenditure of opioid settlement funds; and,
- (ii) states the specific strategy or strategies the county or municipality intends to fund pursuant to Option A or Option B, using the item letter and/or number in Exhibit A or Exhibit B to identify each funded strategy; and,
- (iii) states the amount dedicated to each strategy for a specific period of time.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, in alignment with the NC MOA and SAAF, the expenditure of opioid settlement funds held in the special revenue fund established by the board of commissioners in accordance with Section D of the MOA is hereby authorized for the specific strategies pursuant to MOA Options A or B and in the amounts dedicated to each funded strategy for the specific period of time as set out below:

- 1. First strategy authorized
 - a. Name of strategy: Recovery support services
 - b. Strategy is included in MOA Exhibit A
 - c. Item letter and/or number in Exhibit A:3
 - d. Amount authorized for this strategy: \$650,000
 - e. Period of time during which expenditure may take place: Start date February 20, 2024, through end date June 30, 2027
 - f. Description of the program, project, or activity: Establish a Recovery Center that will provide recovery support services including peer support, linkage to treatment and healthcare services, SMART recovery groups, transportation, and harm reduction services.
 - g. Provider: Cumberland County Department of Public Health
 - h.

The total dollar amount of Opioid Settlement Funds appropriated across the strategies listed above is \$650,000, as revised with Grant Project Budget Ordinance Amendment # BR 241417, incorporated herein by reference.

BACKGROUND

The initial revenue sources for the capital project budget for Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District Water Main Extension – Phase 1 are from the Capital Investment Fund and County ARPA funds. The Cumberland County Board of Commissioners allocated \$10M in Capital Investment Fund on December 17, 2019, to Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District and \$10M from ARPA funds. The Board initially recommended the \$10 million dollar allocation from ARPA on March 21, 2022, as part of BR 220627. The Capital Investment Fund has been used to complete preliminary reports and studies for the Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District. The remaining funds will be rolled into this Capital Project Ordinance.

At their January 25, 2024, meeting, the ARPA committee obligated the \$10M in funds to be used for Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District.

The County has also received a letter of intent for funding dated October 18, 2023 from the Division of Environmental Quality. There are \$17,765,984 in loan funds from the Drinking Water State with \$1,000,000 of that amount in principal forgiveness funds. There is an additional \$4,871,016 as an ARPA project grant. The total funding from state loans and grants is \$22,637,000. The state loan funds must be approved by the Local Government Commission. Revised milestones included in this letter are proposed to be developed upon completion of the Preliminary Engineering Report review by DEQ. The Preliminary Engineering Report is to be submitted on January 31, 2024. The engineering estimate for the Phase I project costs is \$35,625,744. The Capital Project Ordinance will be amended upon award of these funds.

The scope of work to be initiated in the next year includes test wells, property acquisition, design, permitting,

production wells, water quality and treatment evaluation, and public outreach. It is anticipated that the tank and distribution line construction will be funded primarily from state grants and loans. The engineering contract will be presented to the Board at a future meeting. The property acquisition contract for Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District in the amount of \$598,500 was approved by the Board on November 9, 2023.

The engineering fees in the proposed budget reflect planning, design, permitting, bidding, and construction phase services for the Phase 1 project. The contracted services budget reflects the contracted services for land acquisition for the entire Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District.

GRAY'S CREEK WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT CAPITAL PROJECT – PHASE I

Project Description: The primary purpose of the Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District -Phase I project is to bring potable public water to an area that currently has privately-owned drinking water wells that exceed the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed drinking water limits for PFOA and PFOS, as well as four additional analytes tied to adverse health effects. The proposed limits are 4 parts per trillion for PFOA and PFOS; and site-specific limitations on any mixture containing one or more of PFNA, PFHxS, PFBS, and/or GenX. Potential risk is assessed for these four chemicals using a hazard index calculation, defined in the proposed rule. This standard equates to approximately 10 parts per trillion for GenX. The project includes completion of a test well program, installation of productions wells, water treatment, water lines, and elevated storage, and public outreach. Water distribution lines will primarily be funded by proposed state loans and grants that are in process to be funded at a later date.

The revenue sources for the initial portions of this project include funds from the American Rescue Plan Act and the County's Capital Investment Fund.

SUBJECT: INTENT TO SELL AND EXCHANGE CERTAIN PROPERTY IN THE CUMBERLAND INDUSTRIAL CENTER

BACKGROUND

The attached **Exhibit A** shows the lots adjoining Research Drive in the Cumberland Industrial Center. The property with the address number of 4801 is the location of Fayetteville Steel, which is owned by a limited liability company in which Michael O'Hern is the principal. The property with the address number of 500 is owned by Mr. O'Hern. Mr. O'Hern wishes to expand Fayetteville Steel to the property with the address number of 500, which will require crossing the county-owned lot identified as "A" adjoining Research Drive on the east and the county-owned strip of land adjoining Research Dive on the west with equipment to move steel products. That strip of land is a portion of the county-owned land with the boundary shown in blue font on **Exhibit A.** It contains 41.08 acres and is described as "wetlands" on the plat recorded in Plat Book 109-155 as a "small branch." By observation, the channel of this small branch is approximately 20' wide and 8' deep. It is a significant topographic feature on this boundary line.

To accomplish this expansion of his business, Mr. O'Hern wishes to acquire the county-owned property identified as "A" and the strip of county-owned property lying between Research Drive and his property with the address of 500. The county-owned parcel identified as "A" consists of 1.19 acres and is shown on the plat recorded in Plat Book 68-13 as "undevelopable." It does contain a sign for Cumberland Industrial Center. Mr. O'Hern has offered \$5,000 for this parcel. Mr. O'Hern is willing to purchase the other strip of land or exchange it for a strip of his property to give the county better access to the 41.08-acre tract, which is identified as Lot 5A of the Cumberland Industrial Center on the plat recorded in Plat Book 95-128. The strip of land to be exchanged would be 50' in width and run parallel to the common boundary line from a point in the boundary line that is an extension of the northeastern intersection of Assembly Court and Research Drive, which is identified as "Survey Point" on **Exhibit A**.

The county attorney presented this matter to the board in closed session May 11, 2023. The consensus of the board was to proceed with the transaction to include the exchange of the stirp of land on the west side of Research Drive. Mr. O'Hern has been unable to get the necessary survey done and is still seeking a surveyor. He states that the need for expanding his business is pressing and he requests a right to use the county's properties to access his property with the address number 500, to include construction of a bridge, pipes, or culverts across the branch on the common boundary line as soon as possible.

This transaction complies with the statutory requirements for the transfer of land as an economic development activity because it enables an existing industry in the Cumberland Industrial Center to expand its business operations and enhances access to Lot 5A in the Center. The statute requires the board to conduct a public hearing on this transaction upon ten days' notice of the board's intent to convey this property. The date for the public hearing is set forth in the Resolution of Intent.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

To accommodate the expansion of this existing industry in the Cumberland County Industrial Center without any cost to the county and improve the access to Lot 5A in the Center, the county attorney advises the board to adopt the attached Resolution of Intent, which sets forth the board's intent to complete this transaction subject to certain conditions when the survey is obtained and grants a temporary license to cross the county's property to Mr. O'Hern's property until such time as the transaction is completed.

The board approved the recommended action unanimously at the February 8, 2023, Agenda Session.

Whereas, Michael O'Hern has offered to purchase the lot located in the Cumberland Industrial Center described as Outparcel A on the plat recorded in Plat Book 68 at page 13 for \$5,000 and to exchange a strip of land 50' in width adjacent to the common border of his property with PIN 0423897739 and the county's property with PIN 0423982018 for a distance running from the point which is an extension of the northeast corner of the intersection of Assembly Court and Research Drive to the southern boundary of his property for the strip of county-owned land adjoining the western boundary of Research Drive north of Assembly Court, all as shown on **Exhibit A** attached hereto; and



BACKGROUND

Code Enforcement staff received a complaint regarding a dilapidated structure located at 3376 King Charles Rd. The neighboring property owner, Patsy Davis, indicated that the manufactured home located on their property was owned by her deceased brother and had fallen into disrepair. The deceased's wife and son inherited the property, and they have not made repairs or remediated the condition of the property. Based on the complaint, Code Enforcement staff investigated the home and began the process of enforcement to have the home demolished as it is now beyond repair.

Following a duly noticed hearing, the property owners were ordered to bring the property into legal compliance by the County hearing officer. The property owners have failed to correct the situation, and an ordinance directing the demolition of the structure is necessary to bring the property into compliance.

RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

Staff recommends the Board of Commissioners conduct a hearing and approve the demolition order.

AN ORDINANCE OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, DIRECTING THE DEMOLITION OR REMOVAL OF A STRUCTURE IN VIOLATION OF THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY MINIMUM HOUSING AND NONRESIDENTIAL BUILDING CODE CASE MH-6638-2023

WHEREAS, former N.C.G.S. Chapter 160A, Article 19, Part 6, Sections 160A-441, et seq., now N.C.G.S. Chapter 160D, Article 12, authorizes the board of commissioners of a county to enact an ordinance establishing minimum housing standards for dwellings and providing for enforcement thereof by ordinances directing those unfit dwellings be repaired, closed, or demolished;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County, North Carolina, pursuant to and in accordance with said General Statutes has enacted the Minimum Housing and Nonresidential Building Code of Cumberland County (Chapter 4, Article IV, of the Cumberland County Code), (the "Code") authorizing said board to adopt an ordinance ordering an unfit dwelling or dwelling unit or other substandard structure to be repaired, altered, improved, vacated, closed, removed or demolished;

WHEREAS, the Cumberland County Minimum Housing Inspector (the "Inspector") submitted to the board of commissioners a request for an ordinance ordering the repair, closure or demolition of an unfit dwelling or dwelling unit or other substandard structure, more particularly described below, which was found to be in violation of the Code; and

WHEREAS the board of commissioners, at a hearing conducted during its regular meeting on February 19, 2024, considered such request and it appeared to the board that the owners, occupants, and other parties in interest in said property are:

Linda Canady and Joseph Lee Canady, II, owners Patsy Davis, agent for Joseph Lee Canady, II, by power of attorney State of North Carolina, lien holder

And said board further determined that said owners, occupants or other persons having a legal or equitable interest in the property were properly and timely served with notice of such hearing and its purpose and that of such persons the following appeared and were heard at such hearing:

Patsy Davis, as attorney-in-fact for Joseph Lee Canady, II

NOW THEREFORE, having heard such of the foregoing persons as did appear and having reviewed the record in this matter and the findings and orders of the Inspector that are a part of such record, and other evidence presented by the inspector, the said board FINDS AND DETERMINES AS FOLLOWS:

1. The premises subject to this hearing and alleged to be in violation of the Code consist of the structures and land located in <u>Pearces Mill Township</u>. Cumberland County, and more particularly being the premises with the address 3376 King Charles Road, Fayetteville, NC, with PIN 0425-15-7656, described in the deed recorded in Deed Book 4442 Page 0771 of the Cumberland County Registry.

2. The premises are in violation of the Code as set forth in the order issued by Hearing Officer Scott Walters dated April 26, 2023, case number MH-6638-2023 (the "Order") which is incorporated herein by reference.

3. The Order directed the owners to bring the dwelling into compliance by either repairing, altering, and improving the dwelling up to a minimum standard or by demolishing the structure and then causing the debris to be removed by the premises by a date not later that Juley 20, 2023.

4. The Order gave the owners, Linda Canady, and Joseph Canady, II, until July 20, 2023, to comply with it; and the Order was not appealed to the Housing Appeals Board.

5. The violations of the Code cited in the Order have not been corrected.

6. Said owners, without lawful cause, failed or refused to comply the Order within prescribed time. The inspector has since re-inspected the premises and determined that, as of the date of notice of the hearing before this board was sent to the owners, the owners continued the failure or refusal to comply with the Order.

7. The structure which is the subject of the Order is an abandoned mobile home, described by the attorney-infact for owner Joseph Canady, II, as vacant, in a state of disrepair, rotted and collapsed.

8. The structure which is the subject of the Order cannot be rehabilitated under existing statutes, ordinances, and rules and regulations of the State of North Carolina and the County of Cumberland to the standards required by the Code cannot be maintained and secured so that it is not a health and safety hazard.

9. The structure which is the subject of the Order:

- a. has not been secured by locking, boarding up or otherwise barring entrance to the structure. by vagrants, squatters, or other trespassers or by animals, specifically including rodents and other disease vectors;
- b. constitutes a health hazard to persons occupying or trespassing upon the property, to persons living nearby and to the general public; and
- c. constitutes a fire hazard to adjoining property and to the public.

10. Patsy Davis, as attorney-in-fact for owner, Joseph Lee Canady, II, consents to demolition of the structure.

Upon such findings of fact, the board of commissioners CONCLUDES AND DETERMINES AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Minimum Housing Inspector has held full and proper hearings upon this matter. No appeal was made to the Housing Appeals Board. The board of commissioners has fully reviewed the findings and order of said inspector and determines that all orders and determinations thereof are just and proper.

2. The structure described above is dilapidated because violations of the Code have rendered it unsafe and unsanitary and dangerous and detrimental to the health, safety, and welfare of any person who might reside in or occupy such dwelling or dwelling unit.

3. The structure which is the subject of this ordinance constitutes an imminent danger to the public health, safety, or welfare unless and until it is timely repaired or demolished and the debris thereof removed.

WHEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY, FINDINGS, DETERMINATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS SET FORTH ABOVE, THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ORDAINS:

1. That, Linda Canady and Joseph Canady, II, be, and hereby are, ordered, within a period of thirty (30) days from the effective date of this ordinance, to remove or to demolish the structure on the premises described above and thereafter to remove the debris thereof from the premises and otherwise cause the premises to come in compliance with the Code and other applicable ordinances and regulations of Cumberland County.

2. If the owners of the structure fail to comply in a timely manner with the removal or demolition ordered herein, the Inspector be, and is hereby, ordered forthwith to accomplish, with respect to said removal or demolition of said property, precisely and fully what the owners were ordered by this ordinance to do.

3. If the Inspector causes the removal or demolition of the structure pursuant to this ordinance, the Inspector shall sell the saleable materials thereof, and any saleable personal property, fixtures or appurtenances found in or attached thereto, if any, and shall credit the proceeds of the sale against the cost of the removal or demolition. The Inspector shall deposit any balance remaining with the Superior Court of Cumberland County for disposition in accordance with N.C.G.S. 160D-1203(7)c.

4. The Inspector is hereby ordered to report to the board of commissioners the amount of the cost of any removal or demolition incurred by the county in executing this ordinance.

5. The amount of such costs approved by the board of commissioners shall be a lien against the real property upon which the cost is incurred, which lien shall be filed, have the same priority, and be collected as the lien for special assessment provided in Article 10 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes

6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption.

7. This ordinance shall be recorded in the office of the register of deeds and shall be indexed in the name of the property owners in the grantor index.



BACKGROUND: The following is a report on Minimum Housing case number MH-6638-2023.

Property Owners: Linda Canady, Joseph Lee Canady II, and Party of Interest, State of North Carolina

Property Address: 3376 King Charles Rd., Fayetteville, NC

Tax Parcel Identification Number: 0425-15-7656

SYNOPSIS: I inspected this property on July 21, 2022. The property owners were legally served with Notice of Violations and were afforded a hearing on April 20, 2023. Linda Canady attended the hearing. Joseph Lee Canady II was incarcerated in the Harnett County detention center at the time of the hearing, and Patsy Davis, his agent under a Power of Attorney attended the hearing. After hearing from those present and considering the evidence, it was ordered by the Hearing Officer, Scott Walters, that the property be brought into compliance with the Cumberland County Minimum Housing Ordinance by repair or by demolishing the structure and having all debris removed no later than July 20, 2023. The property owner in attendance was notified of the appeal rights and procedures when they were served with the Findings of Fact and Order attached hereto as Exhibit A. No appeal was filed. Upon my visit to the property on July 21, 2023, no corrective action has been made to the property, nor was the structure demolished. The structure has collapsed and is vacant and unsecure with overgrowth of vegetation. In its present state, the structure is unfit for human habitation, and it constitutes a fire, health, and safety hazard. In its present state, the structure cannot be repaired and must be demolished.

The estimated cost to demolish the structure and clear the property of debris is \$6,500.00. The Assessor for Cumberland County has the structure addressed as 3376 King Charles Rd. and presently valued at \$3,697.00. A map depicting the location of the property is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

RECOMMENDATION: IT IS THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PLANNING & INSPECTION DEPARTMENT THAT THE STRUCTURE BE DEMOLISHED AND THE DEBRIS REMOVED FROM THE LOT.

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

I consent to the demolition as agent of Joseph Canady II.



BACKGROUND

The initial revenue sources for the capital project budget for Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District Water Main Extension – Phase 1 are from the Capital Investment Fund and County ARPA funds. The Cumberland County Board of Commissioners allocated \$10M in Capital Investment Fund on December 17, 2019, to Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District and \$10M from ARPA funds. The Board initially recommended the \$10 million dollar allocation from ARPA on March 21, 2022, as part of BR 220627. The Capital Investment Fund has been used to complete preliminary reports and studies for the Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District. The remaining funds will be rolled into this Capital Project Ordinance.

At their January 25, 2024, meeting, the ARPA committee obligated the \$10M in funds to be used for Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District.

The County has also received a letter of intent for funding dated October 18, 2023 from the Division of Environmental Quality. There are \$17,765,984 in loan funds from the Drinking Water State with \$1,000,000 of that amount in principal forgiveness funds. There is an additional \$4,871,016 as an ARPA project grant. The total funding from state loans and grants is \$22,637,000. The state loan funds must be approved by the Local Government Commission. Revised milestones included in this letter are proposed to be developed upon completion of the Preliminary Engineering Report review by DEQ. The Preliminary Engineering Report is to be submitted on January 31, 2024. The engineering estimate for the Phase I project costs is \$35,625,744. The Capital Project Ordinance will be amended upon award of these funds.

The scope of work to be initiated in the next year includes test wells, property acquisition, design, permitting,

production wells, water quality and treatment evaluation, and public outreach. It is anticipated that the tank and distribution line construction will be funded primarily from state grants and loans. The engineering contract will be presented to the Board at a future meeting. The property acquisition contract for Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District in the amount of \$598,500 was approved by the Board on November 9, 2023.

The engineering fees in the proposed budget reflect planning, design, permitting, bidding, and construction phase services for the Phase 1 project. The contracted services budget reflects the contracted services for land acquisition for the entire Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District.

The County Manager, as Budget Officer, is hereby authorized to transfer funds between line items within this capital project ordinance, however, any net increases or decreases to total capital project ordinance appropriations shall require a capital project ordinance amendment by the Board of Commissioners.

Section 5. Within five days after adoption, copies of this ordinance shall be filed with the Finance Officer, Budget Officer, and Clerk to the Board, to be kept on file by them for their direction in the disbursement of County funds for this project.

GRAY'S CREEK WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT CAPITAL PROJECT – PHASE I

Project Description: The primary purpose of the Gray's Creek Water and Sewer District -Phase I project is to bring potable public water to an area that currently has privately-owned drinking water wells that exceed the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed drinking water limits for PFOA and PFOS, as well as four additional analytes tied to adverse health effects. The proposed limits are 4 parts per trillion for PFOA and PFOS; and site-specific limitations on any mixture containing one or more of PFNA, PFHxS, PFBS, and/or GenX. Potential risk is assessed for these four chemicals using a hazard index calculation, defined in the proposed rule. This standard equates to approximately 10 parts per trillion for GenX. The project includes completion of a test well program, installation of productions wells, water treatment, water lines, and elevated storage, and public outreach. Water distribution lines will primarily be funded by proposed state loans and grants that are in process to be funded at a later date.

The revenue sources for the initial portions of this project include funds from the American Rescue Plan Act and the County's Capital Investment Fund.
