Chairman Lancaster called the meeting to order.

Commissioner Evans provided the invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

Recognition of Commissioner Charles Evans As First Vice President of the N.C. Association of Black County Officials

**BACKGROUND**

Commissioner Charles Evans was sworn in as the first vice president of the N.C. Association of Black County Officials (NCABCO) for 2018-2019 on August 24, 2018. Commissioner Evans was the association's second vice president for 2017-2018. The association held its annual meeting in conjunction with the N.C. Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) annual conference in Hickory.

In addition to his leadership position with the state Association of Black County Officials, Commissioner Evans was appointed to serve on the Justice and Public Safety Steering Committee for the National Association of Counties (NACO).

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Commissioner Adams recognized Commissioner Charles Evans stating he was sworn in as the first vice president of the N.C. Association of Black County Officials (NCABCO) for 2018-2019 on August 24, 2018 during the N. C. Association of County Commissioners annual conference in Hickory. Commissioner Adams stated he was the association's second vice president for 2017-2018. Commissioner Adams stated in addition to his leadership position with the N. C. Association of Black County Officials, Commissioner Evans was appointed to serve on the Justice

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and Public Safety Steering Committee for the National Association of Counties (NACO).

Commissioner Adams also recognized Commissioner Marshall Faircloth as the District 6 Director and a member of the Taxation and Finance Steering Committee, and County Manager Amy Cannon who was appointed by the association to serve on a working group convened by the UNC School of Government and the Local Government Commission. Commissioner Adams stated the working group will produce findings and recommendations related to fund balances maintained by local boards of education and a mechanism to resolve disputes related to capital outlay as an alternative to litigation. Commissioner Evans and Ms. Cannon expressed their appreciation for the opportunity to serve and represent Cumberland County.

Chairman Lancaster recognized in attendance District Court Judge Talmage Baggett, Clerk of Court Lisa Scales, Social Services Director Brenda Jackson and ABC Board Manager David Horne.

## 2. PRESENTATIONS

### A. Presentation on Successful Clear the Shelters Event at Cumberland County Animal Control

#### BACKGROUND

Assistant County Manager Tracy Jackson will introduce Animal Control Director Elaine Smith who will report on the Clear the Shelters event held August 18, 2018, at the Animal Shelter. During the day, 118 dogs and cats were adopted, as well as one ferret.

The Public Information Office will also show a short video highlighting the day's activities.

#### RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

For information purposes only.

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Tracy Jackson, Assistant County Manager, thanked the Board of Commissioners for allowing the county to participate in the national event and stated with this being the first event for Cumberland County, it was very successful. Mr. Jackson stated there are a lot of people who need to be thanked including Animal Control staff, the large number of individuals who came to the community to adopt animals and the strong volunteer contingent at Animal Control. Elaine Smith, Animal Control Director, acknowledged shelter staff who work holidays and weekends caring for approximately 300 animals housed at the shelter and Animal Control officers who are in the field 24/7 every day of the year responding to calls from the community and providing service. Ms. Smith thanked the Board of Commissioners for the opportunity and Animal Control staff for making the event so successful. Ms. Smith stated over 900 shelters nationwide participated with over 100,000 pets being adopted over the last few years due to these events. Ms. Smith stated in Cumberland County, 188 animals were adopted including dogs, cats and one ferret and almost 700 individuals passed through the shelter on the day of the event. A video followed.

Chairman Lancaster recognized Judge Baggett who stated he is the Environmental Court judge that ends up hearing court cases involving animals. Judge Baggett commended the county for investing in this program and stated the county gave up around \$12,000 in adoption fees as its contribution to the event. Judge Baggett stated the event received media coverage and created a positive spin for Cumberland County and Animal Control. On behalf of the court system, Judge Baggett thanked the Board of Commissioners and staff of Animal Control.

WHEREAS, Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) address the needs of the frail elderly and disabled adults ages 55 and older, a population which is growing rapidly and whose impact on health care costs is significant; and

WHEREAS, PACE are fully integrated models of care that provide comprehensive, highly coordinated care allowing frail older adults who meet state eligibility criteria for nursing home level of care, to continue living in the community; and

WHEREAS, Individuals enrolled in PACE receive all Medicare and Medicaid covered items and services and additional support which promote well- being and greater independence; and

WHEREAS, PACE assumes full financial risk for all care and medical services, including transportation, hospitalization, and long-term care in return for capitated payments from Medicare and Medicaid, thereby controlling costs for the state while providing improved health outcomes and improved quality of life; and

WHEREAS, LIFE at St Joseph of the Pines opened in 2011, operating throughout the City of Fayetteville, Cumberland County, Hoke County, and portions of Harnett, Moore and Robeson counties, having served approximately 674 participants and families.

NOW THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners hereby proclaims September 2018 as PACE MONTH in Cumberland County and commends its observance to the Cumberland County community.

- D. Approval of Capital Project Ordinance #190001 for the Ann Street Landfill Partial Closure Project

BACKGROUND

A portion of the Solid Waste Department's Subtitle D Landfill needs to be closed with a protective final cover in accordance with North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) regulations. The area that has been identified for partial closure cannot receive any additional waste and is at maximum height. The operating permit dictates the final elevation of waste and the area for closure has reached that elevation. The partial closure project will satisfy the requirements of NCDEQ, protect the environment, and help to reduce ongoing maintenance of that area of the Subtitle D landfill. The estimated closure cost of \$3,550,000 was provided by SCS Engineers for budgetary purposes based on construction quality assurance standards. The project is expected to take less than one year to complete.

Solid Waste unassigned fund balance is being utilized to cover the cost of this partial closure project.

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## RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

### CAPITAL PROJECT BUDGET ORDINANCE #190001 SUBTITLE D LANDFILL – PARTIAL CLOSURE PROJECT

The Cumberland County Board of Commissioners hereby adopt the following Capital Project Ordinance in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes 159-13.2:

Section 1. The project authorized is the Subtitle D Landfill – Partial Closure Project. The revenue source will be a transfer from the Solid Waste Fund Balance.

Section 2. The following projected expenditure is appropriated for this project:

Capital Outlay – Landfill Closures	\$3,550,000

Section 3. The following associated revenue is appropriated for this project:

Solid Waste Fund Balance	\$3,550,000

Section 4. The County Manager, as Budget Officer, is hereby authorized to transfer funds between line items within this capital project ordinance, however, any net increases or decreases to total capital project ordinance appropriations shall require a capital project ordinance amendment by the Board of Commissioners.

Section 5. Within five days after adoption, copies of this ordinance shall be filed with the Finance Officer, Budget Officer, and Clerk to the Board, to be kept on file by them for their direction in the disbursement of County funds for this project.

## BACKGROUND

North Carolina General Statute 159, Article 3, entitled "The Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act" requires all checks drawn on an official depository be signed by the Finance Officer or a properly designated Deputy Finance Officer and countersigned by another official of the local government designated for this purpose by the Governing Board. The act also requires the Deputy Finance Officer to have a faithful performance bond in an amount not less than \$10,000 or more than \$250,000.

Finance staff has recently reconciled signature cards of bank accounts held in the name of Cumberland County to appointed Deputy Finance Officers as approved by the Board of Commissioners. Approval of this item will ensure compliance with G.S. 159 as check signers on the specified accounts will then be properly designated as Deputy Finance Officers. Upon

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approval, staff will then move forward in securing faithful performance bonds for each of the named employees.

#### RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

1. Approve the appointment of the named employees of the Sheriff's Office and Department of Social Services as Deputy Finance Officers as named for the specific accounts on each resolution.

- H. Approval of Offer to Purchase Surplus Property Located at 504 Carteret Place, Fayetteville, NC

#### BACKGROUND

The County and the City of Fayetteville acquired the real property with the PIN 0520-94-5534, being 504 Carteret Pl Lt 350 Sec 10 College Lakes Pt A, located at 504 Carteret Place, Fayetteville, NC, at a tax foreclosure sale in 2012 for a purchase price of \$9,226.29. The property is zoned SF10 with a tax value of \$20,000.00. The City conveyed its interest in the property to the County on August 22, 2018, by a quitclaim deed recorded in Book 10365 at page 546. Based on the GIS Mapping and the tax records, there is a structure on the lot. Don Gilmore made an offer to purchase the property for \$9,226.29. If the Board proposes to accept this offer, the proposed sale must be advertised subject to the upset bid process of G. S. § 160A-269. The proposed advertisement is included in the recommendation below.

#### RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION

The County Attorney recommends the Board consider the offer of Don Gilmore. If the Board proposes to accept the offer, resolve that the described real property is not needed for governmental purposes and direct that it be advertised and sold pursuant to the upset bid process of G. S. § 160A-269.

- I. Approval of Budget Ordinance Amendments for the September 4, 2018 Board of Commissioners' Agenda

#### BACKGROUND

General Fund 101

1. Health Department - Budget Ordinance Amendment B190777 to transfer State funds of \$175,886 for the General Health-Triple P (Positive Parenting Program)

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment B190777 in the amount of \$175,886 representing state funds. This revision represents the movement of State funds from Contracted Services to Salaries/Fringes to create three positions as requested by the North Carolina Department of Public Health - Health and Human Services. At the time of the FY19 Budget, the State had not identified how the positions would be classified, therefore the positions were placed in Contracted Services. These positions are fully funded by the State and require no County funds. The positions will develop strategies to implement and support Triple P (Positive Parenting Program), an evidence-based parenting intervention across an 18-county region assigned by the State.

Please note this amendment requires no additional county funds.

REGARDING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS 2 - 4 PLEASE NOTE:

Each fiscal year County departments may have projects that are not complete by the fiscal year end (6/30/18) or items ordered that have not been received by fiscal year end. These projects or items were approved in the Fiscal Year 2018 budget; however, the money was not spent by June 30, 2018.

The following amendments seek to bring those funds forward from FY 2018 into the current fiscal year, allowing departments to complete and pay for these items. These revisions are not using 'new' funds but are recognizing the use of FY18 funds in FY19.

3.C. Approval of Chapin Hall at the University of Chicago Contract for the Department of Social Services

**BACKGROUND**

The purpose of this contract renewal with Chapin Hall at the University of Chicago is to allow for the continued development of a multidimensional and integrative service delivery model for aging out foster children and older teens in transition to adulthood in Cumberland County DSS custody to improve their outcomes. Chapin Hall acts as a trusted intermediary to assist CCDSS to integrate all efforts, such as A Model Approach for Change in Child Welfare (AMAC-CW), and to collaborate with Cumberland's Partners to create a model for change in child welfare. AMAC-CW employs a modified approach to collective impact that will result in an effective, articulated, and documented approach to system changes that will improve outcomes for older youth in foster care and advance child welfare and family support programs in Cumberland County. Duke Endowment has awarded Cumberland County DSS a multi-year grant for the implementation plan for AMAC-CW, in an effort to reform child welfare systems.

**RECOMMENDATION / PROPOSED ACTION**

We respectfully request your approval of the contract renewal for Chapin Hall at the University of Chicago for \$100,894.50.

Commissioner Keefe asked whether this contract was 100% county funded. Brenda Jackson, Social Services Director, stated the contract is a Duke Endowment Grant and 100% of the endowment funds run through the county's budget for the Model Approach for Change in Child Welfare (AMAC) project. Ms. Jackson stated this is a two-year grant and this is the second year of grant funding. Ms. Jackson stated Social Services will return for another renewal around January because the county receives the grant funds in two installments. Ms. Jackson stated Social Services is currently in the process of applying for years three and four. In response to a question posed by Commissioner Boose, Ms. Jackson explained Chapin Hall is a national child research firm and a think tank for research involving data and evidence-based work. Ms. Jackson also stated the University of Chicago is known for social work and Chapin Hall donated two years of their service prior to receiving the grant.
